## **JBC Report:**

 Discussion of procedural issues regarding how and to whom JBC report should be distributed. M Gade noted that Draft JBC report was sent to UCOP prior to the meeting. This has been practice for some time per A Harris. He also noted that because CUCEA Chair is part of the Faculty Welfare Committee, report will be shared by him after approved by both CUCEA and CUCRA at the meeting.

# UCOP recognition of retiree/emeriti organizations (including insurance coverage):

- This issue was discussed at length at the morning meeting and record of that discussion is included in minutes of joint meeting.
- Additional issues discussed by CUCRA: Insurance needs of Retirement Association and Emeriti Association may be different on each campus as activities are different; therefore, insurance should be tailored accordingly.

# **UC PATH project:**

J Lewis (UCOP) noted that the primary goal for UC PATH at present is to consolidate payroll services for all campuses.

## Impact of budget cuts:

- M Schnaubelt asked about whether Healthcare Facilitators will remain on each campus as specific benefits positions are being eliminated. Several attendees shared the situations on their individual campuses that have resulted from budget cuts. Impact of budget cuts on many of these issues is not yet known.
- J Lewis noted that the Retirement Administration Service Center (RASC) was currently upgrading self-service tools and trying to understand how to manage post-employment benefits with the "new tier" retirement options that will be implemented for the future.
- M Waldman noted that for the past Open Enrollment period, 6 temporary employees were hired by his office to field telephone calls. They were able to exceed the service level of answering calls within 90 seconds

- Started as a social organization at first; now provides volunteers at Lab events, e.g., the annual wellness fair and Open House
- Recent survey about retirement included 425 respondents

#### **UC Irvine: M Schnaubelt**

- Scholarships given to staff members to continue education
- Overwhelming favorable interest in pursuing a senior living facility
- Annual golf tournament now named in memory of a long-time financial planner who helped many retirees

#### **UC Davis: D Pritchard**

- Board is developing mission statement and tag line
- Survey is in progress about retiree center activities
- Working on how to increase membership and volunteer involvement;
   Suggested having mini workshops on volunteerism and ways to increase membership using expertise from our own ranks; this could be done before or after the CUCRA meeting
